HISTORIC ANNOUCEMENT LA PASSERELLE-I.D.É. OPENS L'AGAPANTHE TRANSITION HOME OF LA PASSERELLE-I.D.É. FOR AFRICAN FRANCOPHONE REFUGEES

TORONTO, May 2nd, 2025 – <u>La Passerelle-I.D.É.</u> today announced the historical opening of L'Agapanthe Transition Home of La Passerelle-I.D.É., a 50 beds transition home that provides African Francophone refugees with essential housing and support as they establish themselves in Canada.

L'Agapanthe builds on La Passerelle-I.D.É.'s longstanding commitment to the economic development and integration of racialized Francophone refugees. L'Agapanthe provides a comprehensive, culturally responsive support system, built and led by racialized Francophone refugees.

"Today marks an important step forward in our city's commitment to welcoming and supporting those in need. With the opening of L'Agapanthe, Ontario's first francophone transitional home for African refugees, we are addressing a critical need while recognizing the diverse strengths that enrich our city. This initiative by La Passerelle-I.D.É., is especially crucial given the City's recent challenges in providing adequate support for African refugees. In recent years, newly arriving refugee claimants have been the fastest growing client group in the City's shelter system, putting tremendous strain on resources and prompting urgent response measures. Culturally appropriate homes like L'Agapanthe offer much-needed relief to our shelter system.I extend my gratitude to everyone who worked tirelessly to make this possible and the federal government for providing the funding necessary to establish Refugee Homes city-wide" – **Councillor Chris Moise**

"L'Agapanthe represents a new transition home model of support and addresses a gap in the delivery of African Francophone refugee services in Ontario," **said Ahmat Hassane**, Chair of La Passerelle-I.D.É. "We are not only providing a place to stay but creating an environment where individuals can access the tools, networks, and opportunities needed to succeed."





L'Agapanthe is structured around four key areas of support.

- 1. Housing stability ensures individuals have access to secure, temporary accommodations while working toward permanent solutions.
- 2. Employment and economic empowerment programs connect residents with job opportunities, career training, and mentorship.
- 3. Education and personal development initiatives provide access to language training and skills development, helping newcomers navigate the transition successfully.
- 4. Cultural and social inclusion programs foster a sense of belonging through mentorship and engagement with the Francophone and Anglophone communities.
